## LIGURIA STUDY CENTER FOR THE ARTS AND HUMANITIES

*Located on the Italian Riviera in the small town of Bogliasco near Genoa, the Bogliasco Foundation's Liguria Study Center offers residential fellowships for artists and scholars who have made significant contributions to the arts and humanities. Since opening its doors in 1996, the Study Center has hosted over 650 Fellows. Leaders in their fields, our distinguished Fellows have included United States Poets Laureate, American Academicians, and GRAMMY award winners. They have been the recipients of Guggenheim Fellowships, MacArthur Foundation Fellowships, National Book Awards, Pulitzer Prizes, the Prix de Rome, and numerous other honors.*



### LIGURIA STUDY CENTER FACILITIES

With a maximum capacity of sixteen persons, the Liguria Study Center provides an intimate setting for artistic and scholarly work. The Study Center is comprised of three separate villas. Each villa contains private living quarters, studios equipped with computers, and common rooms. One of the studio spaces is designated specifically for composers and contains a Yamaha upright piano and a Yamaha electronic keyboard. Two studio spaces are available for visual artists, one of which has a small printing press. There is also a studio space with a sprung dance floor for choreographers. All studios have computer connections to a network that provides wireless Internet access. While surrounded by a bustling semi-urban environment, the villas and their gardens offer an oasis of calm with spectacular views of the Mediterranean Sea and the Ligurian coastline.

### BOGLIASCO FELLOWSHIP PROGRAM

Bogliasco Fellowships are awarded, without regard to nationality, to qualified persons doing advanced creative work or scholarly research in the following disciplines: Archaeology, Architecture, Classics, Dance, Film/Video, History, Landscape Architecture, Literature, Music, Philosophy, Theater, and Visual Arts.

Applicants for Fellowships are expected to demonstrate significant achievement in their disciplines, commensurate with their age and experience. An approved project is presumed to lead to the completion of an artistic, literary, or scholarly work, followed by publication, performance, exhibition, or other public presentation.

Approximately 50 Bogliasco Fellowships are awarded each year. They are scheduled during the two semesters of the traditional academic year: from mid-September to the third week of December in fall-winter, and from mid-February to the third week of May in

winter-spring. Fellowships usually have durations of one month. Bogliasco Fellows may be accompanied by spouses or spouse-equivalent companions during their stay. Providing the crucial gifts of space, time, and freedom from the distractions of daily life, Bogliasco Fellowships also encourage international exchange and understanding among Fellows in a stimulating multicultural environment.

Through the support of generous donors who share our commitment to the arts and humanities, we are pleased to be able to offer Special Fellowships from time to time. Some Special Fellowships are dedicated to specific disciplines; others are reserved for persons coming from certain countries or geographic areas. In some cases, Special Fellowships may provide funds to assist Fellows who otherwise might not be able to afford the cost of travel to and from Genoa. All persons who are awarded Bogliasco Fellowships are automatically eligible for Special Fellowship status. No additional application materials are required or accepted.

### ACCOMMODATIONS AND FINANCIAL ARRANGEMENTS

During their stay at the Study Center, Bogliasco Fellows and accompanying spouses/companions are provided with living quarters (bedroom with private bath) and full board. Fellows are assigned separate private studios. When requested in advance, studio facilities for spouses/companions may be made available, either in one of the studios or within their living quarters. The cost of transportation to and from Genoa is the responsibility of the Fellows, as are all other personal expenses incurred during the Fellowship period.

Children cannot be accommodated at the Study Center. Pets are not allowed. Visits by friends, colleagues, or family members are not allowed, except by prior arrangement.

### APPLICATIONS FOR FELLOWSHIPS
