With literature professor Giancarlo Lombardi, Aciman will discuss his latest novel, *Enigma Variations*, and the new film based on his 2007 novel, *Call Me By Your Name*. Both works are set in part in Italy, and the author completed *Enigma Variations* during a Bogliasco Foundation residency.
